The Slogvik Mill is probably among the oldest mill houses in Norway. You can see the year 1610 scratched on the south wall. The mill has a unique construction. Normally the upper stone are raised and sunken in order to make respectively coarse-grained and fine-grained flour. In the Slogvik Mill the lower stone is the adjustable one.

Numerous of stream mills were spread around in broken landscapes like Tysvær.

They were suitable for the typical small independent farms. In the late 19th and early 20th century, technical mills took over the flour production. The Slogvik Mill was in operation until the 1930s.
